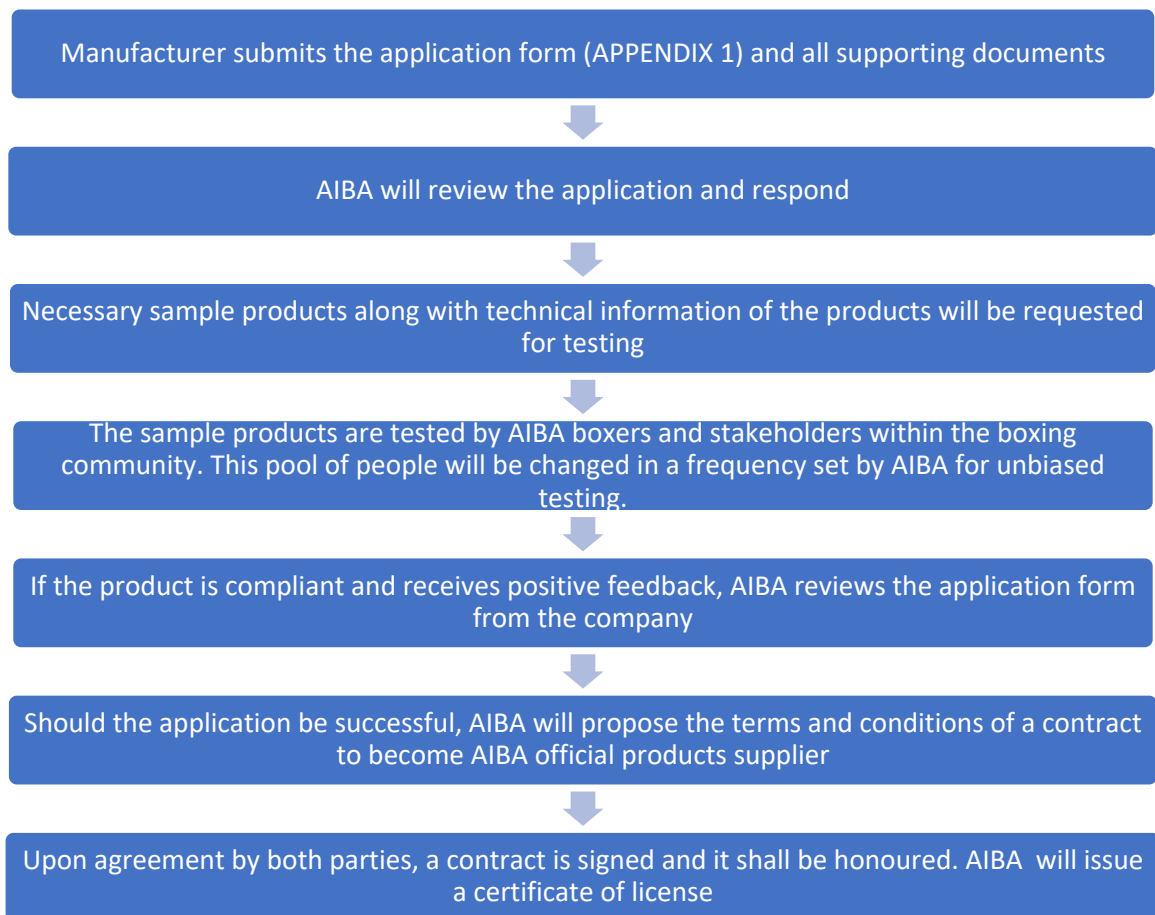
Introduction

The International Boxing Association (AIBA) is a non-profit international organization that succeeded the former Fédération Internationale de Boxe Amateur constituted in 1946. AIBA is the sole worldwide governing body for the sport of boxing in all its forms, with more than 200 Member Federations. Providing high quality equipment to the boxing community contributes to the safety of the sport of boxing and boxers and the quality of the competitions. This document illustrates the process of application for becoming an AIBA licensee that is categorized into Approved equipment, Inspected equipment, Licensed equipment. At completion of the application process, the applicant will enter officially the AIBA Licensing Program upon signing of a licensing agreement.

There are three types of equipment license in AIBA licensing program.

- **Approved equipment** refers to the highest quality for AIBA homologated products and can only be used by AIBA Official Boxing Equipment Licensee. To be homologated as "Approved", products must go through recognized laboratory tests monitored by AIBA. Only "Approved" competition equipment can supply AIBA owned or sanctioned competitions, including but not limited to AIBA Open Boxing competition (AOB), Continental-level events, Global Boxing Cup.
- **Inspected equipment** refers to the entry level of quality certification for AIBA homologated products. Any manufacturer can apply to AIBA to have its equipment inspected and homologated by AIBA. The use of "Inspected" product is limited to National Federation's events including their International tournaments or cups, and their national affiliations, as well as AIBA development programs.
- **Licensed equipment** refers to the equipment not formally regulated by AIBA Competition Rules or Technical Rules yet are considered indispensable for the sport of boxing. The items include but not limited to training equipment (focus pad, punching bag, etc), scale, protector (gumshield, cup protector), and must go through quality tests monitored by AIBA. The use of "Licensed" products is recommended to AIBA member Federations.

Process of obtaining AIBA License for equipment



The equipment must undergo a testing process focused on four (4) different areas: Quality, Conformity, Sustainability and Marketing, and consists of four (4) phases.

Phase A: The applicant to submit together with the fully completed application form:

1. Company credential presenting company image, branding and marketing plan, and any other information reasonably required by AIBA to assess the financial situation of the company (e.g. sales volume and financial statement from the past two years).
2. Certificates of International Organization for Standardization (ISO) or Technischer Überwachungsverein (TÜV) regarding the sustainability aspects of your production including but not limited to health and safety of labors, environment, management of quality, etc.

Phase B: The applicant to send:

1. Samples with declared specifications of the materials used to be assessed by AIBA or AIBA appointed expert(s) to ensure its compliance with AIBA Technical & Competition rules. (The applicant shall cover the incurred conformity check fee)
2. In the case of Boxing Ring, AIBA will send expert(s) to inspect on-site and assess based on experts' reports. (The travel and accommodation cost shall be covered by the applicant.)

Phase C: AIBA will send the samples to be tested by users in AIBA Family (the applicant shall cover the incurred shipping fee).

Phase D: Laboratory certification (Expense to be fully covered by the applicant)

At the end of the process, AIBA shall deliver the required certification, provided that:

- all phases have been successfully completed, in AIBA's discretionary opinion.

The invoices covering the costs of the process have been duly paid by the applicant.

* By entering into a max. 3 (generally 4) years multiple-years agreement in accordance with the Olympic cycles (i.e. Paris Cycle 2021- 2024), a **12 %** discount will be offered if payment is made in one full instalment.



* Each licensee can apply for more than one items being approved or inspected or licensed. AIBA will charge an additional 2,500 USD management fee per item, the costs of the AIBA Licensee Application Process (in particular costs of the lab test). The rate for additional items shall be 25% of the otherwise applicable rate.
